

2 Corinthians 1:11 "you also joining in helping us through your prayers, so that thanks may be given by many persons on our behalf for the favor bestowed on us through the prayers of many."

- A. We are still waiting for our visa. Ask God to sovereignly work in the lives of government officials to speedily grant entrance visas. *Proverbs 21:1 The king's heart is like channels of water in the hand of the LORD; He turns it wherever He wishes.*
- B. We are continuing to collect Bibles, Bible reference works and Bible study aids for Cameroon. Pray for the provision of these precious volumes for pastors in Cameroon. *Philippians 4:19 And my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus.*
- C. A ministry team lead by Dr. Chip McWilliams and Rich Smith of Heritage Baptist Church in Oklahoma City will be joining me. Ask God to divinely empower them for the ministry of God's Word. Pray also for their spiritual and physical protection. *Thessalonians 3:1-2 Finally, brethren, pray for us that the word of the Lord will spread rapidly and be glorified, just as it did also with you; and that we will be rescued from perverse and evil men; for not all have faith.*
- D. Oppose satan who will stop at nothing to keep thwart the ministry of God's Word. Stand with us against this evil and vile serpent. *James 4:7 Submit therefore to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you.*
- E. As I prepare to minister in Cameroon, please claim these passages as you intercede on our behalf at the throne of grace asking God to grant strength, protection and stamina for the days ahead. *Isaiah 40:29-31*
29 He gives strength to the weary, And to him who lacks might He increases power.
30 Though youths grow weary and tired, And vigorous young men stumble badly,
31 Yet those who wait for the LORD Will gain new strength; They will mount up with wings like eagles, They will run and not get tired, They will walk and not become weary.




The problem - notice the paperback Bible held together with tape being used by this minister
