To know for sure that God will answer a prayer, we need to pray in His will (I John 5:14-15). We can know His will by seeing it in His Word – the Bible. As a result we can focus our prayers to be effective by basing them on scripture (John 15:7). Below is an example prayer for use before teaching the Bible.

"Lord, this is your Holy Word. Your Word is perfect, restoring the soul. Your Word is sure, making wise the simple. Your precepts are right, rejoicing the heart. Your judgments are true; they are righteous altogether. By them Your servant is warned; In keeping them there is great reward. Your Word is more desirable than gold, yes, than much fine gold; Sweeter also than honey and the drippings of the honeycomb. And Lord, your Word is very pure, therefore your servants love it." (Psalm 19:7-11, Psalm 119:140, Psalm 12:6)

"Lord, we ask that you would plow up the hard ground of our hearts and use your Word to send roots downward and bear fruit upward in our lives for your glory".

(Mark 16:14, Psalm 95:6-10, Proverbs 28:14, Proverbs 29:1, Hebrews 4:7, Hebrews 3:12-15)

"Like a mirror Lord, use your Word to show us who we really are, compared to what you want us to be". (James 1:22-25)

"Drop your Word like a plumb line against our lives and reveal to us where we are falling short in our obedience to you". (Amos 7:7-8)

"Unsheath now the Sword of Your Spirit and use it to judge the thoughts and intentions of our hearts". (Ephesians 6:17, Hebrews 4:12-13)

"We ask these things in the name of our Lord and Savior and Your Son, Jesus Christ". (John 14:13-15)

**Plumb Line:** a tool that consists of a small, heavy object attached to a string or rope that is used to see if something (such as a wall) is perfectly vertical.

## <u>I John 5:14-15</u>

This is the confidence which we have before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. <sup>15</sup> And if we know that He hears us *in* whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests which we have asked from Him.

#### John 15:7

If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you.
