Everywhere we go we find God opening the door to minister the Gospel. These are truly unique times and God has certainly gotten the attention of not only our city, our country but of the world. It is a shame in the midst of this exciting period of openness that many in the church view it as a sign of Christian maturity to not share Christ and if you do discuss Christ to not use Holy Scripture. For many to simply live a Christian testimony but not clearly present the Gospel is a higher standard than to simply and plainly place the Gospel message before men and ask for a decision. For others to talk around the Gospel without quoting Bible verses or using the Bible is more sophisticated and more spiritual than using the holy, eternal, written Word of God to bring men and

women to a saving knowledge of Christ. Eleanor and I continue to purchase New Testaments, Tracts and Evangelistic Book to give to those to whom we share the Gospel. We continue to ask people to join us in Bible study, be it evangelistic or discipleship. God the Holy Spirit makes it clear that His written Word is central both in witnessing and in discipling new believers.

The Word of God and witnessing 1 Peter 1:23 "for you have been born again not of seed which is perishable but imperishable, that is, through the living and enduring word of God."

We have the example of the Apostles as well

Acts 8:35 Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning from this Scripture he preached Jesus to him.

Acts 17:2 And according to Paul's custom, he went to them, and for three Sabbaths reasoned with them from the Scriptures

Acts 18:24 & 28 Now a Jew named Apollos, an Alexandrian by birth, an eloquent man, came to Ephesus; and he was mighty in the Scriptures ... for he powerfully refuted the Jews in public, demonstrating by the Scriptures that Jesus was the Christ.

Both a lyricist and composer, he ensured he would always remember words or melodies that came to him at odd times: "No matter where I am, at home or hotel, at the store or traveling, if an idea or theme comes to me that I deem worthy of a song, I jot it down in verse. In this way I never lose it." When the world-renowned lay preacher, Dwight Lyman Moody, lay on his death bed in his Northfield, Massachusetts, home, Will Thompson made a special visit to inquire as to his condition. The attending physician refused to admit him to the sickroom, and Moody heard them talking just outside the bedroom door. Recognizing Thompson's voice, he called for him to come to his bedside. Taking the Ohio poet-composer by the hand, the dying evangelist said, "Will, I would rather have written "Softly and Tenderly Jesus is Calling" than anything I have been able to do in my whole life.")
