

Equipping Leaders

A key component of GCI's ministry is that of building up and equipping leadership in local churches, with an emphasis on pastoral staff. From preaching Sunday mornings in local churches to hosting regional conferences geared specifically towards pastors, we sought to remain faithful to this calling during our time in Yaoundé, Cameroon. In writing to Philemon, the Apostle Paul remarked that "I have come to have much joy and comfort in your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you, brother" (Philemon 1:7). Herein lies the heart of our ministry to local pastors and their wives - to encourage them in service to their congregation and further equip them in ministry. Refreshing Hearts

Across Cameroon, we observed the devastating impacts of the Pentecostal "Health and Wealth" Doctrine in churches. Themes such as the "Year of Miracles" or "Year of Blessing" are both popular and common, yet these phrases fail to fully represent the teachings of our Savior Jesus Christ who promised His disciples that "in the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world" (John 16:33). As an alternative to such teachings, I challenged local Baptist and Presbyterian pastors to instead sponsor themes of a "Year of Lordship," "Year of Scripture Memory," or "Year of Witnessing" among their flocks. Many churches are now experiencing the fruit of these labors in more spiritually mature congregations and eager lay leaders.

To further encourage and equip church leadership in remaining steadfast and trusting the teachings of Scripture as it pertains to life and ministry, we hosted several conferences in partnership with various churches:

- Our four day Pastor's Renewal Conference emphasized the importance of a continued deep walk with God and staying true to the Doctrines of Grace in the face of the many false doctrines which plague this country.
- At Maranatha Baptist Church, Eleanor and I conducted a four night Marriage Covenant Seminar from 5–8 pm each evening; I was greatly humbled by the number of men who took time off from work to attend with their wives.

• Our church Leadership Conferences stressed Jesus Christ as Lord, cultivating lives as men and women of prayer, as well as building marriages and families that reflect the Word of God.
