 - A. Ask God to honor the sacrifices El is making for the ministry
Mark 10:29-31

- ☐ 29 *Jesus said, "Truly I say to you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or farms, for My sake and for the gospel's sake,*
- ☐ 30 *but that he will receive a hundred times as much now in the present age, houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and farms, along with persecutions; and in the age to come, eternal life.*
- ☐ 31 *"But many who are first will be last, and the last, first."*

B. El uses as her template in teaching women that which is supplied by God the Holy Spirit in Titus chapter two. Ask God to bless both her words and the ears of the listeners as she teaches and instructs these important Scriptural principles which are meant for women of all times in all ages. El finds herself teaching both "older women" and "younger women". Ask God to empower her instruction of both these groups.

Titus 2:3-5


- ☐ 3 *Older women likewise are to be*
 - *reverent in their behavior,*
 - *not malicious gossips*
 - *nor enslaved to much wine,*
 - *teaching what is good,*
- ☐ 4 & 5 *so that they may encourage the young women*
 - *to love their husbands,*
 - *to love their children,*
 - *5 to be sensible,*
 - *pure,*
 - *workers at home,*
 - *kind,*
 - *being subject to their own husbands,*
 - *so that the word of God will not be dishonored.*

C. There is nothing more encouraging to a wife on the mission field than to have the resources necessary to care for her and her husband's needs. Ask God to bless our ministry materially that El might be fulfilled as helpmate, homemaker and wife, no matter the circumstances to which we are called.


- ☐ *Psalms 134:3 May the LORD bless you from Zion, He who made heaven and earth.*

I like these two photos as they show the number of ladies who come out to greet El on her arrival or say good-bye to her when we depart. She has impacted the lives and marriages of women all over the world and I praise God for such a godly and devout wife.



At an age when many women are settling in to enjoy the fruits of a lifetime devoted to husband, children, family and church Eleanor finds herself packing and unpacking in over 27 countries throughout the world. Her home is her suitcase, her porch as often as not is a cold airport and her friends say good-bye more often than hello. Yet I have never heard her once complain nor question her commitment to her ministry as my helpmate.



Eleanor's gift in languages is a great blessing. The Franco-phone women of Cameroon feel a special kinship with her as she is able to minister to them in French.

Karolina Wilhelmina Sandell-Berg; *Born:* October 3, 1832, in the rectory at Fröderyd, Småland, Sweden; *Died:* July 27, 1903, Stockholm, Sweden.; *Buried:* Solna Cemetery, near Stockholm. Lina was the daughter of Jonas Sandell, pastor of the Lutheran church in Fröderyd. At age 26, she accompanied her father on a boat trip across Lake Vättern to Göteborg, during which he fell overboard and drowned before her eyes. The tragedy profoundly affected Lina and reportedly inspired her to write hymns. Known as the [Fanny Crosby](#) of Sweden, she wrote 650 hymns. She married Stockholm merchant C. O. Berg in 1867, but continued to initial her hymns “L. S.” What is missing from the modern praise movement of the 21st century are songs of praise to God which spring from tragedy. The ability to worship God, “trusting in my Father’s wise bestowment” in the midst of tragedy, even if that tragedy is to watch your earthly father drown before your helpless eyes is a message much needed and a worship much called for in the church today.
