- A. El's "life verse" - 1 Peter 5:7 "casting all your anxiety on Him, because He cares for you."
- B. Ministry - this is the passage from which Eleanor teaches. Ask God to empower her speaking and to make the hearers hearts receptive to God's Word

Titus 2:3-5 Older women likewise are to be...teaching what is good, so that they may encourage the young women

- C. That God would honor the sacrifices she is making to be my “helpmate” on the field. Many wives of this age decline to travel with their husbands. Still others are enjoying the fruits of a lifetime of devotion to home, children and church. I praise God for a godly wife who stands by me in my calling but I am ever aware of the great sacrifice she is making. Won’t you please join with me in asking God to honor this sacrifice, even as He has done in the past for godly women such as Sarah, Ruth and Esther...

Luke 18:28-30

28 Peter said, "Behold, we have left our own homes and followed You."

29 And He said to them, "Truly I say to you, there is no one who has left house or wife or brothers or parents or children, for the sake of the kingdom of God,

30 who will not receive many times as much at this time and in the age to come, eternal life."

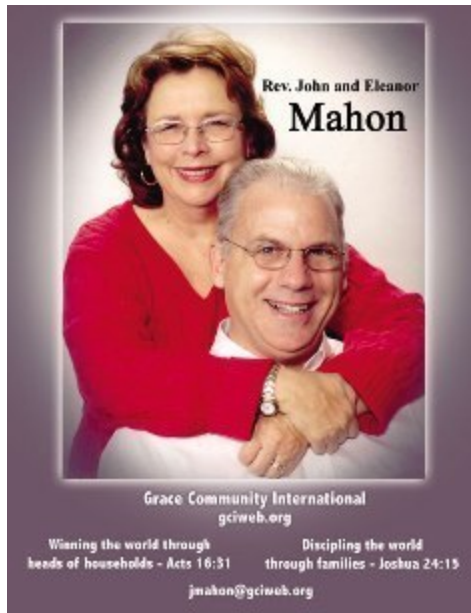
- D. Call upon the Lord to grant Eleanor the physical, emotional and spiritual strength to fulfill the calling God has given her. Countries like Russia, Nigeria, Cameroon, Zambia (to name a few) can be a challenge to young men. The ministry is carried out by us only by the power of your sustaining prayers.

Isaiah 46:3-4 " Listen to Me... You who have been borne by Me from birth And have been carried from the womb; even to your old age I will be the same, And even to your graying years I will bear you! I have done it, and I will carry you; And I will bear you and I will deliver you."

- E. That God would bless Eleanor materially. It is my observation that the greatest burden the wives and children of missionaries face is that of financial resources. When these are in place the majority of burdens are lifted from them. This is my responsibility - to faithfully raise our support so that Eleanor may fulfill her role as missionary wife, helpmate and migrant homemaker in safety and security. Pray for me that I would be faithful but also pray for our prayer warriors and support team that they would stand with us not only in prayers but also in the financial support of this ministry.

Karolina Wilhelmina Sandell-Berg; *Born:* October 3, 1832, in the rectory at Fröderyd, Småland, Sweden; *Died:* July 27, 1903, Stockholm, Sweden.; *Buried:* Solna Cemetery, near Stockholm. Lina was the daughter of Jonas Sandell, pastor of the Lutheran church in Fröderyd. At age 26, she accompanied her father on a boat trip across Lake Vättern to Göteborg, during which he fell overboard and drowned before her eyes. The tragedy profoundly affected Lina and reportedly inspired her to write hymns. Known as the [Fanny Crosby](#) of Sweden, she wrote 650 hymns. She married Stockholm merchant C. O. Berg in 1867, but continued to initial her hymns "L. S." What is missing from the modern praise movement of the 21st century are songs of praise to God which spring from tragedy. The ability to worship God, "trusting in my Father's wise bestowment" in the midst of tragedy, even if that tragedy is to watch your earthly father drown before your helpless eyes is a message much needed and a worship much called for in the church today.
