Your faith, prayers, and gifts continue to make a difference as we prepare to depart for Nigeria!




We are at war...

Both the doctor, PA and receptionist shared that they were hoping to get a book since they were always such a blessing. (They all got books!) In fact, the surgeon told me that it didn't matter who got which books as they passed them around after reading them.

The police officer who pulled over when he saw me get run off the road insisted on changing the tire. During our conversation, he shared that he had just joined a church. He was excited to get a New Testament for his car, a Case for Christ by Strobel for himself, and a book about mothers praying for his wife. In God's sovereignty, we just bought those books and had them in the back of our car.

At the MRI clinic, I was surprised to find that a gentleman in the waiting room was a retired firefighter and had served with a gentleman in my Sunday School class. He was excited to get a Case for Christ and assured me he would read it.

As far as the packing party goes, the UPS driver told me that he specifically asked for this route because the Bible and books I give out meant so much to him. He said that when he finishes with them, they go in the break room where others read them and then return them. The pizza delivery man who brought us dinner for the packing party was also excited about receiving Case for Christ. He said, "I am not a big reader of paper books, but I will read this one tonight. I have been thinking about Jesus since Easter."

Packing Party Report

We praise God for another successful packing party! You generously donated enough funds to enable us to order Bibles and pastoral study books at a volume discount. As these resources slowly accumulated in our home office, we eagerly planned the event so that volunteers might get to work as soon as they arrived. Volunteers and sorted labeled Bibles and books before packing these treasures in boxes weighing between 50-70 pounds.



As team members sealed boxes and labeled them in preparation for travel with me to the airport and beyond, these men and women also prayed over each box and the work and ministry of God's Word in the life of each pastor and church body. As a result of this ministry, national



pastors are equipped with the Word of God as well as quality reference and doctrines works for their library. These volumes generally exceed the monthly salary of the recipient pastor.
