
E. Pray that God would bless the ministry materially, that we might in turn bless those to whom we minister.



May – Zambia – Once again we will be ministering with Nelson Musipa throughout the great country of Zambia. We will also be bringing with us Bibles, Bible study aids and


Bible reference works for pastors, ministers and student workers. Pictured here is the truck filled with God's precious cargo made possible by your gifts and prayers of faith.

Beneath the Cross of Jesus

Beneath the cross of Jesus I fain would take my stand,
The shadow of a mighty Rock within a weary land;
A home within the wilderness, a rest upon the way,
From the burning of the noonday heat and the burden of the day

*There lies beneath its shadow but on the further side
The darkness of an awful grave that gapes both deep and wide
And there between us stands the cross two arms outstretched to save
A watchman set to guard the way from that eternal grave.*

Upon that cross of Jesus mine eye at times can see
The very dying form of One who suffered there for me;
And from my smitten heart with tears, two wonders I confess
The wonders of His glorious love and my own worthlessness

*I take, O cross, the shadow for my abiding place;
I ask no other sunshine than the sunshine of His face;*

*Content to let the world go by, to know no gain nor loss,
My sinful self my only shame, my glory all the cross.*

(Elizabeth C. Clephane Born: June 18, 1830, Edinburgh, Scotland. Died: February 19, 1869, Bridgend House, near Melrose, Roxburghshire, Scotland. Published posthumously in the *Family Treasury*, a Scottish Presbyterian magazine, in 1872, titled “Breathing on the Border.” The magazine’s editor, W. Arnot, wrote:

“These lines express the experiences, the hopes and the longings of a young Christian lately released. Written on the very edge of life, with the better land fully in [view](#) of faith, they seem to us footsteps printed on the sands of time, where these sands touch the ocean of Eternity. These footprints of one whom the Good Shepherd led through the wilderness into rest, may, with God’s blessing, contribute to comfort and direct succeeding pilgrims.”

Elizabeth was the third daughter of Andrew Clephane, Sheriff of Fife and Kinross. She lived most of her life in Melrose, Scotland, about 30 miles southeast of Edinburgh. She spent most of her money on charitable causes, and was known locally as “The Sunbeam.” Clephane’s hymns appeared posthumously, almost all for the first time, in the *Family Treasury* (1872), under the general title of “Breathings on the Border.”)
