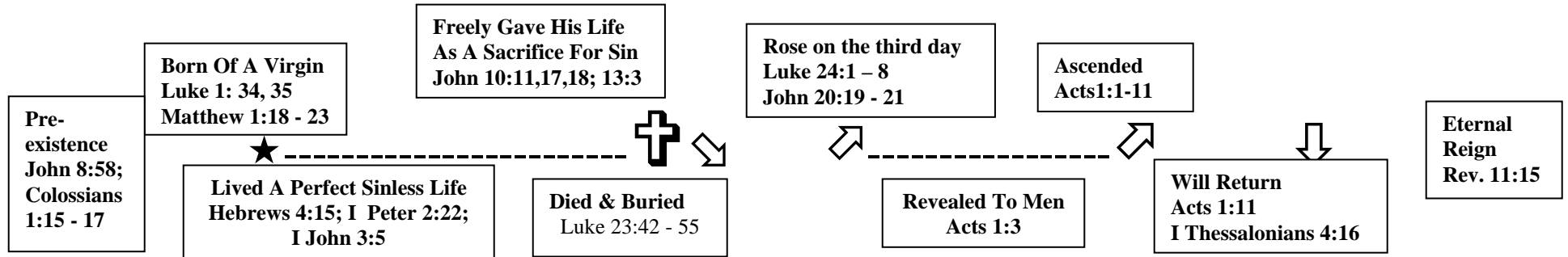

Acts 1:8 Witness – A universal call and provision for all believers vs. Ephesians 4:11 Evangelist – A specific gifting and calling limited to a those chosen by God
Romans 1:16 – The “Not Ashamed” clause entails both Communication and Content
I Corinthians 9: 20 – 23 Our bottom line for life decisions, yet framed within the Word of God and balanced by I Corinthians 15:33
I Corinthians 1:23; I Peter 1:22 – 25; II Corinthians 4:5 Jesus Christ, The Risen Savior as revealed in the Word of God is the central aspect of our witness
Hebrews 4:12, I Peter 1:23 Our witness is inseparable from the Word of God.
